Duties and Responsibilities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • To provide responsible leadership by sharing in decision making, and in supervising unit activities. • To be a role model and help girls develop a sense of self and become confident, kind, caring individuals. • To plan, organize and deliver programs which include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Regular Unit meetings • Activities with other branches • Carrying out active programming involving; <div style="border: 1px dashed black; padding: 5px; margin: 5px 0;"> Helping girls develop camping and outdoor skills, leadership skills, develop an understanding of heritage in Canada and globally, develop an appreciation for nature, develop home management skills and explore science and technology, hobbies, nutrition, active living, creative interests and personal values. </div> • To challenge girls (<u>ages nine to twelve years old</u>) to reach their individual potential and empower them to give leadership and service as responsible citizens. • To maintain good relations and communicate effectively with parents, the public and all Girl Guide Members. • To maintain accurate and current records for the Unit and for each girl. • To attend trainings to upgrade skills and have current knowledge. • To attend District meetings and events as required.
Qualifications and Requirements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Females only. • Must pass a screening process including reference checks and a police check. • Patience, compassion and the ability to be flexible. • Ability to work independently and also as a TEAM PLAYER (very important). • Very good planning and organizational skills. • Enthusiasm and resourcefulness. • Very good communication skills.
Time Requirement	AVERAGE = 4 to 5 HOURS PER WEEK.
Orientation & Training	Required to attend an orientation and a Guide Leader's training. Safe Guide training must also be completed within 12 months of having started volunteering. Additional opportunities for advanced training in a variety of skills and interests (for example, dance, drama, communication, bird watching, storytelling, event planning, camping and outdoor activity skills) is also provided.
